## **1. Millard Street Drop Off Zone**

This department recently met with parents, school officials, crossing guards and bus drivers to come up with some possible solutions to address concerns on Millard Street regarding drop off at the elementary school in the morning.

One suggestion that was supported by the crossing guard was the removal of the guard shack at the intersection of Millard Street/Margaret Street. The crossing guard advised that she no longer utilized the shack and that several people had concerns about it being a visual obstruction.

On November 8<sup>th</sup> I did have the Public Works Department remove the shack and safely store it should we need it in the future.

The other suggestion that received full support at the recent gathering was establishing a drop off zone on Millard Street that was designated for parents to just pull up on the north side of Millard Street and drop off their children without parking and leaving their car for any length of time. This allows for efficient and safe dropping of students without them having to cross the street and keeps traffic flowing.

The final suggestion that received full support was the closing of the small parking lot off of Millard Street. This parking lot is a concern because it crosses over the sidewalk that is heavily used by students and parents in the morning and afternoon. School officials were in agreement and are looking to close that parking lot in the near future.

This department is requesting approval of signage to create a drop off zone on the north side of Millard Street between 7:30am-8:30am only during school hours. This will cause a very minimal inconvenience for the three property owners that reside on that side of the street.

## **2. Crossing Guard Substitute positions**

Sandy James recently notified this department that she needs to resign from her substitute crossing guard duties. Sandy has been a faithful and loyal substitute for the past couple of years. This department will greatly miss her.

Due to her resignation, I am looking to add three people that have recently applied to be substitute crossing guards. I recommend that this city hires Wanda Engel, Beth Panten and James Panten as substitute crossing guards.

### **3. Proposed Tall Grass/Weed Ordinance Change**

This department proposes a change to 252-3 H which changes the height from 12 inches to 6 inches. Our current ordinance states that weeds, grass and plants over 12 inches shall be cut. This department along with public works feels that is too high to effectively keep lawns and weeds under control.

The other change is to 252-8 which changes the service of notice to once per calendar year versus the current ordinance which requires us to serve notice each time a violation is detected.

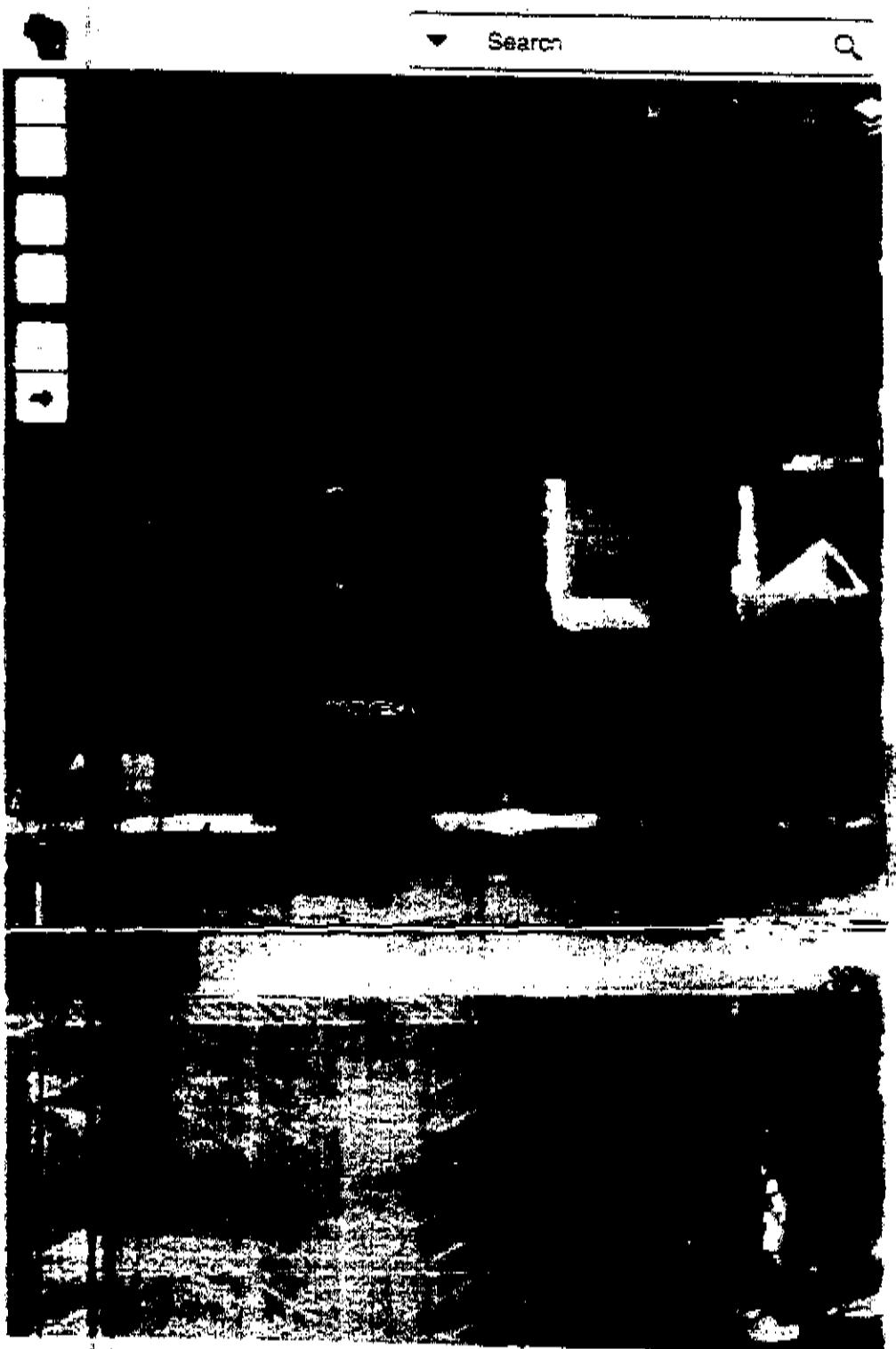
The cost section also changes so that it spells out the costs that will be billed along with the fact that damages to city equipment will also be billed to the property owner.

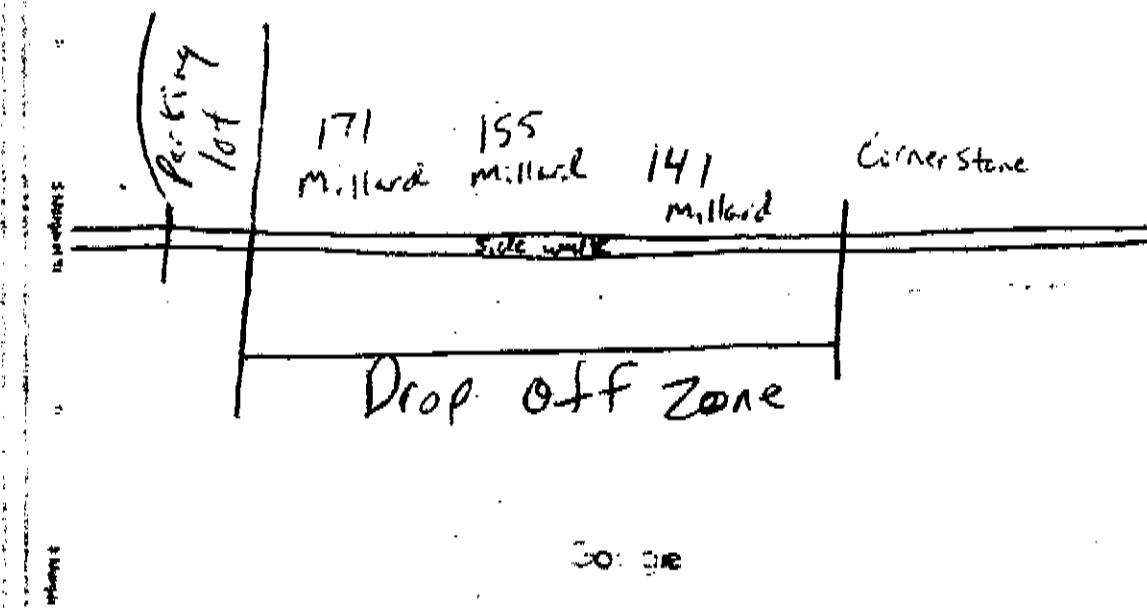

## Chapter 252. Nuisances

### Article I. Public Nuisances

#### § 252-3. Public nuisances affecting health.

The following acts, omissions, places, conditions and things are hereby specifically declared to be public health nuisances, but such enumeration shall not be construed to exclude other health nuisances coming within the definitions of § 252-2 of this article:

- A. Adulterated food. All decayed, adulterated or unwholesome food or drink sold or offered for sale to the public.
- B. Unburied carcasses. Carcasses of animals, birds or fowl not intended for human consumption, or foods which are not buried or otherwise disposed of in a sanitary manner within 24 hours after death.
- C. Breeding places for vermin, etc. Accumulations of decayed animal or vegetable matter, trash, rubbish, rotting lumber, bedding, packing material, scrap metal or any material whatsoever in which flies, mosquitoes, disease-carrying insects, rats or other vermin may breed.
- D. Stagnant water. All stagnant water in which mosquitoes, flies or other insects can multiply.
- E. Privy vaults and garbage cans. Privy vaults and garbage cans which are not flytight.
- F. Animals. All animals running at large.
- G. Air pollution. The escape of smoke, soot, cinders, noxious acids, fumes, gases, fly ash or industrial dust within the City limits or within one mile therefrom in such quantities as to endanger the health of persons of ordinary sensibilities or to threaten or cause substantial injury to property.
- H. Noxious weeds. All noxious weeds, as defined in § 66.0407(1), Wis. Stats. In addition, other rank growth of vegetation, and all weeds, grasses and plants over 12 inches in height, excluding trees and shrubs, which:
  - (1) Detract from the surrounding area and properties.
  - (2) Become a possible fire hazard, as determined by the Fire Chief.
  - (3) Become a health hazard due to their pollen or a potential cover for disease-carrying rodents and other small animals.
  - (4) Are of infectious or poisonous nature in or adjacent to a populated area, regardless of height.
  - (5) Become a potential hazard to vehicular traffic in vision clearance triangles.

## Chapter 252. Nuisances

### Article I. Public Nuisances

#### § 252-8. Weed control.

- A. Noxious weeds and rank growth prohibited. No owner or occupant of any lot or parcel shall allow such property to become overgrown with any weeds or grass so as to constitute a public nuisance, as defined in § 252-3H of this article.
- B. Notification. The Mayor shall annually, on or before May 15, publish a Class 2 notice, under Ch. 985, Wis. Stats., that every person is required by law to destroy all noxious weeds and other rank growth of vegetation, as defined in § 252-3H of this article, on land in the City which he owns, occupies or controls.
- C. Enforcement. If a property owner fails to control the growth of such weeds or rank growth of vegetation on his property, the Weed Commissioner shall serve upon him notice as to this fact. If such owner fails to abate this nuisance within five days after service of the notice, the Commissioner shall take action to abate such public nuisance.
- D. Costs. If the City causes a nuisance to be removed as provided in Subsection C above, the actual cost thereof, together with an administrative fee equal to 10% of the actual cost, shall be charged to the property owner. If such charges are not paid by November 1 of the year in which they are billed, such charges, together with an additional administrative fee for collection equal to 10% of the total of such charges and fees, shall be extended on the next succeeding tax roll as a tax charged against the property affected and collected in the same manner as are other taxes, pursuant to § 66.0517, Wis. Stats.

H. Noxious Weeds/Tall Grass. All lawns, grasses and noxious weeds as defined in SS 66.407(1), Wis. Stats. On nonagricultural lots and parcels of land, as classified under the zoning code, within the City of Markesan which exceed six inches in length, which:

C. Enforcement. If a property owner fails to control the growth of such lawn, grass or weed on their property, the Weed Commissioner or their designee shall serve upon them one notice per calendar year as to this fact. If such owner fails to abate this nuisance within five days after service of the notice, the commissioner shall take action to abate such nuisance.

If that same property owner fails to control growth on their property again during the same calendar year, the original notice shall stand as their notice and action will immediately be taken to abate such nuisance.

D. Costs. If the City causes a nuisance to be removed as provided in Subsection C above, the first time per calendar year shall be \$110.00 dollars, the second time per calendar year shall be \$220.00 dollars and for the third and subsequent times it shall be \$440.00 dollars.

Any damage to city equipment while abating such nuisance will also be billed to the property owner.

If such charges are not paid by November 1 of the year in which they are billed, such charges, together with an additional administrative fee for collection equal to 10% of the total of such charges and fees, shall be extended on the next succeeding tax roll as a tax charged against the property affected and collected in the same manner as are other taxes, pursuant SS. 66.0517, Wis. Stats.

ORDINANCE NO. 7-2017

## Amending Chapter 80 Fund Balance Policy, Ordinance 80-3.

The County Board of Supervisors of Green Lake County, Green Lake Wisconsin, duly assembled at its regular meeting begun on the 18th day of April, 2017, does ordain as follows:

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED**, that Chapter 80, Fund Balance Policy, Ordinance 80-3 is hereby amended as follows (deletions are in ~~strikeout~~, additions are in **bold face type**):

### §80-3 Administration.

At fiscal year-end, Green Lake County will maintain a minimum unassigned general fund reserve balance of not less than 20% of the actual current year general fund expenditures, ~~with a minimum of 15% for health and human services, 10% of the minimum unassigned general fund balance to be used as contingency for the following fiscal year excluding refundable prepayments and GAAP defined non-spendable, restricted, committed and assigned (designated) account balances.~~

**At fiscal year-end, Green Lake County will maintain a minimum unassigned Health and Human Services (HHS) fund reserve balance of not less than 15% of the actual current year HHS fund expenditures excluding refundable prepayments and GAAP defined non-spendable, restricted, committed and assigned (designated) account balances.**

**In addition, in order to maximize County operations subsidized by tax levy, the annual Contingency Fund balance shall be designated as non-lapsing with the following exception provision: If on December 31 of any given fiscal year, the General Fund reserve balance shall fall below the General Fund Policy amount as established herein, the December 31 Contingency Fund balance shall lapse to the General Fund, in entirety or in an amount as determined by the Finance Committee, sufficient to bring the General Fund reserve balance into compliance with this policy.**

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED**, that this ordinance shall become effective upon passage and publication
